EVERYONE is required to participate in the debate; your grade depends on your level of participation. You are to support your speaker and answer my/other student's questions throughout. You **must** be knowledgeable about your position and talking points in order to answer the questions.

Individual Assignments

• *Thinking Map* – compare and contrast the basic ideas/arguments of the Federalists and Anti-Federalists. Be sure to include important people that were on each side. A successful Thinking Map will accurately, in great detail, portray the beliefs of each side.
