	An act or decision that sets an example for others to follow
	Total amount of money that a government owes to others
	Certificate that promises to repay money loaned, plus interest, on a certain date
	Tax on foreign goods brought into a country
	Actions that a nation takes in relation to other nations
	Not taking sides in a conflict
	Opposing group within a party
	Not allowed under the Constitution
	Fast-sailing ship with many guns
	Stirring up rebellion against a government
	To cancel
	Ensuring that all people have the same rights
	Idea that government should play as small a role as possible in economic affairs

	Economic system in which individuals, rather than the government, decide what and how much to produce and sell
	An 1803 court case in which the Supreme Court ruled that it had the power to decide whether laws passed by Congress were Constitutional and to reject laws that it considered unconstitutional.
	Power of the Supreme Court to decide whether acts of a President or laws passed by Congress are Constitutional
	Long voyage of exploration
	Mountain ridge that separates river systems flowing toward opposite sides of a continent
	Practice of forcing people into military service
	Ban on trade
	An 1809 law that allowed Americans to carry on trade with all nations except Britain and France
	League of independent states or nations
	Devotion to one's country
